

UFAW SAWI Animal Welfare Student Scholarships

The UFAW SAWI Animal Welfare Student Scholarship awards are based on the successful UFAW Animal Welfare Student Scholarship Scheme (formerly the UFAW Vacation Scholarship Awards) developed in 1983 by the UK-based Universities Federation for Animal Welfare (UFAW). The aim of this scheme is to enable students to pursue their interests in animal welfare and to provide them with the opportunity to conduct relevant research or other (e.g. educational) projects.

Who is eligible to apply?

Applications are welcome from undergraduates (or equivalent) who will usually be studying in agricultural, biological, psychological, veterinary or zoological sciences. However, we would be pleased to receive applications from students from other disciplines who are interested in carrying out a project related to animal welfare. Students must be registered at either a university or college within Israel. Applications from MSc students on appropriate courses will also be considered.

How much is the award?

Successful applicants will receive 1500 Shekels subsistence and project expenses for every week of study up to a maximum of **12,000 Shekels**. Projects may be carried out at any time and usually last between four and eight weeks. Projects may last for longer but funding will only be provided for up to eight weeks. Projects do not have to be carried out in Israel; however no extra money is available for travelling expenses.

What is involved?

Projects must be relevant to improving the welfare of farm, laboratory, companion, zoo or wild animals whose welfare is compromised by humans. Project work undertaken may be part of a student's course, an extension of course-work, or a new project on a topic of interest to the applicant. Students are encouraged to design their own project proposals, but they should seek guidance from tutors and heads of department to ensure that the proposal has a sound scientific methodology, that all necessary facilities are available, and that the work will be properly supervised. Alternatively, supervisors who find a suitable candidate can apply.

Applying for an award

All applications should be submitted on an application form (available from the UFAW website). The form asks for an outline of the proposed project and, where applicable, reference to scientific papers or other work relevant to the investigation. Applications must include a reference from the supervisor and comments by the Head of Department. If a student is to conduct the project at an external establishment (eg zoo or research institute) they must seek prior permission in writing from the appropriate person (eg curator, director).

Applications should include details of:

- Aim
- Methods
- If animals are to be involved, the number and type of animals to be studied.
- Details of any necessary ethical approvals or licence
- Animal welfare benefits: how the work may lead to improvements in animals' quality of life. NB Much as UFAW applauds research that advances species conservation and other important issues – this scholarship scheme is for work that addresses animal welfare.
- How any significant findings will be used and/or made available to others (eg publications/presentations)

Completed applications must reach the UFAW offices by **28th February 2012**.

The applications will be assessed by a panel of judges and then all applicants will be notified of the outcome of this process. Successful students will receive full details and administrative notes at this stage.

Examples of past Scholarship projects

- *Impacts of capture and handling on the welfare of wild birds*
- *What is enriching about environmental enrichment? Investigating properties of materials used in enrichment for pigs*
- *The effects of cage size on aggression and welfare in male mice*
- *Investigation of the possible causes and prevention of eye infections in domestic ducks: Is there a link between the depth of water provided, and the incidence of such infections in ducks?*

What is the UFAW SAWI Fund?

The UFAW SAWI Fund is a fund held by the Universities Federation for Animal Welfare to promote and advance animal welfare in Israel. It is named the SAWI Fund because it was derived from the Society for Animal Welfare in Israel, which became a Fund within UFAW in 2003.

What is UFAW?

The Universities Federation for Animal Welfare (UFAW) is an internationally recognised independent, scientific and educational animal welfare charity. The organisation is concerned with promoting high standards of welfare for farm, companion, laboratory, and captive wild animals, and for those with which we interact in the wild.

- *Promoting and supporting developments in the science and technology that underpins advances in animal welfare*
- *Promoting education, particularly at the university and college level, in animal care and welfare, in current issues and in assessment of welfare*

- *Providing expert advice to government departments and other bodies and amending laws and guidelines*
- *Enlisting the energies of animal keepers, scientists, vets, lawyers and others who care about animals.*
